HOW TO USE THE JOURNAL

The Journal Through the Bible has been designed to go in tandem with the BACC Reading Plan starting in January, but certainly providing opportunity to start whenever you can. If this journal finds you on any day, in any month, jump into the reading plan right where we are!

If you miss your daily reading for a day, or two, or more...it's OK! We would encourage you to pick back up where we are and allow yourself grace.

Each week, you'll find weekly reading pages which provide space to share what you find interesting, questions or thoughts you have while reading Scripture. You'll also see Sunday message pages, to use while you are listening to the messages, whether you are in-person, online or listening later to the podcast. In the back, we have blank pages you can use for reflection, prayer and notes for small groups or trainings you attend throughout the year.

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF READING THE BIBLE IS NOT TO KNOW THE BIBLE, BUT TO KNOW GOD AND KNOW WHAT HE HAS INTENDED FOR EACH OF US!

A life lived in reading God's Word, is a example of a lifetime learner. At Blue Ash Community Church, we believe this is one way to learn more about God, in our pursuit of Him, while living our our faith.

HOW TO STUDY THE BIBLE

OUR GUIDE TO UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE

The following steps will help you gain a better understanding of how to read and reflect on the reading in the Bible:



Find a translation you understand.

The Bible was written in ancient language and translated into modern language to help process the Bible in a way that makes sense. Check out the resources on the next page for help in choosing a Bible translation.



Pick a time and place.

Start by finding a routine that works best for you...are you a morning person or a night owl? Do you like to be in quiet or in a bustling coffee shop? Do you learn by watching, listening or reading? Paper or digital? Once you find your routine, start in the BACC Reading Plan.



Uncover the context.

Think like a detective and discover the story behind the story. To help in your understanding, you can incorporate tools, shared on the following page to learn who the text was written to, when, where and why.



Read slowly and ask questions.

There is no need to rush. Take your time and get curious. After studying the context, what questions do you have? Use your questions as tools to help you dig deeper through prayer, study and in conversations with friends. A small group is a safe place to make friends who will help you process your questions about the Bible.



Pray and apply what you learn.

The Bible is meant to transform us, not just inform us. The more we apply what we learn from God's Word, the more we become like Jesus. Ask God what He wants you to learn about Him and yourself.

How Do I Process the Weird Stories in the Bible?

H.E.A.R journaling

The H.E.A.R journaling method promotes reading the Bible with a lifetransforming purpose, to read in order to understand and respond to God's Word. The acronmyn H.E.A.R. stands for Highlight, Explain, Apply and Respond. Each of these steps contributes to creating an atmosphere to hear God speak.

Here's how to use the **H.E.A.R.** method:

Pray first. Before reading, pause to ask God to speak to you. "Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law (Word)" Psalm 119:18.

Write an H at the top left of your paper. Here write out one or two verses that speak to you. Share the name of the book, the passage of Scripture, the chapter and verse numbers and a title to describe the passage.

Write the letter E under the previous entry. Explain what the text means. Ask some guestions to explain the text. Why was this written? To whom was it originally written? How does it fit with the verses before and after it? Why did the Holy Spirit include this passage? What is He intending to communicate through this?

Ask yourself a series of questions to find out how you can apply this to your life. Challenge yourself to write between 2 - 5 sentences. This is the heart of the process. Here are some questions to help you uncover the significance of the text. How can this help me? What does this mean today? What would the application of this verse look like in my life? What is God saying to me?

Finally R. Your response may take many forms. Maybe a call to action, maybe a prayer, or maybe how the reading changed you. Your response to what you just read. How will I be different because of what God said to me? What will I do now?



2024 READING PLAN

The reading plan is designed to guide you through the Bible, reading books or stories of the Bible that will correlate with the messages you hear on Sunday mornings.

Each week you will have a few books of the Bible or from a book to read, as you make your way through the plan. There are a few of the books that you will read through twice and even three times. The goal is that when you are reading through the second and sometimes third times you are finding new things, learning more and gaining a deeper understanding of God's word.



For additional resources, you can scan the QR Code to find videos to help enhance your reading. These videos will explore the structure of each book, central themes, and dig deeper into some topics covered within the Bible.
